No other information is available for this serial number.



There are, nonetheless, several ines known that are mentioned are ledgers as being shipped with mets. The first of these is serial aber 24,624, which has a bayonet and was shipped with a saber met. Our survey also disclosed

serial number 24,623, a carbine with identical features.

Shown at the top of the facing page, serial number 61,995 is a very unusual carbine with a standard length magazine, but with a 231/2" barrel. The ledgers indicate that this

gun was shipped with an angular bayonet. The muzzle portion of this gun is identical to a musket.

The next photo compares a standard musket (serial number 2705) with carbines, serial numbers 61,995 (23" barrel) and 116,397 (15" barrel).
